THE SNOWFLAKE IS a symbol of beauty, purity, and peacefulness," says the New York-based jeweler Mish Tworowski, whose leisure time in Colorado has inspired the limited-edition series of six jeweled snowflake designs from **Mish New York** (mishnewyork.com). "I feel that modern women love to wear something very luxurious in a bohemian way," he says, "and this is very true in Aspen." Each numbered snowflake (\$16,800 to \$36,000 as shown) can be worn as a brooch, as a necklace on a vintage ribbon, or as a bracelet on a custom-made cuff (\$6,400 each, sold independently). The snowflakes are available in white, yellow, pink, or blackened gold with white or black diamonds. —JILL NEWMAN



Hot Dog

JEFF KOONS'S WHIMSICAL sculptures have appeared on the roof of the Metropolitan Museum of Art and in the halls at Versailles. Fans of the Pennsylvania-born artist's 10-foot-tall *Balloon Dog (Yellow)*, which is in private hands, can now display a limited-edition version of that vibrantly colored stainless-steel artwork at home. Priced at \$8,000, each 10.5-inch-tall, metallic-finished porcelain piece from the French company **Bernardaud** (bernardaud.com) is signed by Koons and available exclusively through the Los Angeles Museum of Contemporary Art (moca.org). Part of the proceeds of the sale will benefit the museum. —CAROLYN HEERS

Remaking History



TIFFANY & CO. has resurrected some of its iconic 1970s creations for the new **Out of Retirement** collection (available exclusively at Dover Street Market in New York, Tokyo, and London through January 2016, doverstreetmarket.com). "These pieces feel just as contemporary today as they were when they were first made," says Tiffany's design director, Francesca Amfitheatrof, who selected from the archives 17 jewelry and gift designs for the collection, including the cuffs shown here (gold and diamonds, \$32,000; gold, \$7,500). Also on offer: a playful sterling-silver pillbox shaped like a miniature Chinese-takeout container. —J.N.
